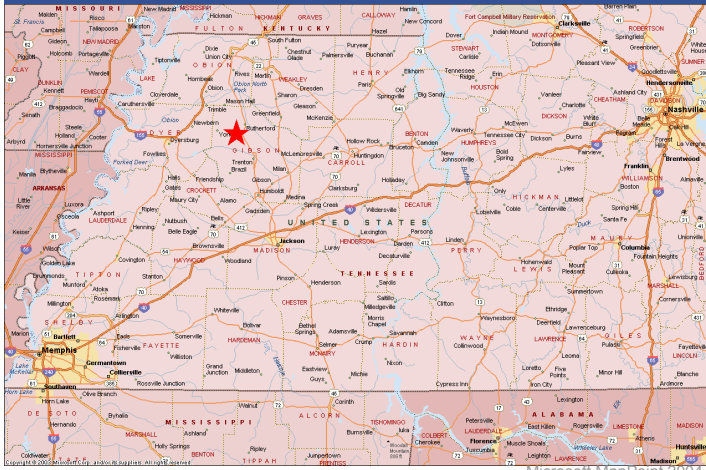

ALERT SUMMARY: MID-TENNESSE TORNADES

INCIDENT SITUATION

MEMPHIS, Tenn. - April 2-7, 2006 - At least six tornadoes touched down in mid-Tennessee on April 2nd, including one that was F-3 force, resulting in 12 fatalities and damage in 20 counties. The storms damaged approximately 3,000 structures and left over 16,000 residents without electricity and natural gas for several days. Some residents sought temporary shelter. The state was declared a disaster area and affected counties were granted federal aid and assistance from the National Guard.

NC4 COVERAGE

NC4 provides ongoing updates to members as the incident unfolds through the NC4 Incident Monitoring Center (NIMC). NIMC analysts follow the incident using official government sources as well as national and local media sources - linking to KSDK-TV 5 local breaking article "Caruthersville Residents Picking Up After Devastating Storm" including video from the scene.

Severe tornadoes leave nine people dead; major structural damage reported. 4/3/06 11:05 am CDT

Thunderstorms, hail, and tornadoes killed at least 30 people in eight states, many in Tennessee. 4/3/06 4:43 am CDT

NWS Tornado Watches remain in effect for 12 states. 4/3/06 12:05 AM CDT

64 tornadoes struck, 28 fatalities resulted. FEMA assessing damage. 4/4/06 10:26 am CDT

Where: Region Wide

Synopsis: Eastern United States - 64 tornadoes struck, 28 fatalities resulted. FEMA assessing damage.

What: Severe weather, including thunderstorms, hail, and 64 tornadoes, hit the Midwest and Southeast on Sunday and Monday, causing at least 28 fatalities. Twenty-four fatalities have been reported in Tennessee alone, with the most destruction occurring along a 25-mile stretch from Newbern to Bradford. Tennessee officials estimate 1,200 structures have been damaged or destroyed.
